Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of emerging market local currency bonds, foreign exchange forwards and other similar securities, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.



Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. The Fund will invest at least 80% of its assets in investment grade and non-investment grade rated bonds, and other similar securities, issued by governments, government related entities or companies of emerging markets, as well as currency forwards and non-deliverable forwards. These are issued by issuers meeting certain minimum ESG and E, and S and G scores and the consideration of lower carbon intensity criteria. Minimum ESG and E, and S and G scores and lower carbon intensities are based on specific measures such as: electricity produced by renewable energy sources and carbon emissions as provided by the Sustainable Accounting Standards Board. The Fund will invest in sustainable bonds such as: sustainabilitylinked bonds, transition bonds, social bonds and green bonds. The average maturity of the Fund is normally between 4 and 10 years. The Fund may invest up to 20% in onshore Chinese bonds, up to 10% in convertible bonds, up to 10% in other funds, may invest in bank deposits and money market instruments. The Fund's primary currency exposure is to emerging market currencies. See the Prospectus for a full description of the investment objectives and derivative usage



Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.




