What is this product?

Type

The Fund is an investment company incorporated as a société anonyme qualifying as a Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable. The Fund's value is dependent on the performance of the underlying assets and may go up as well as down. Any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.

Objectives and Investment Policy

Investment Objective:

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of bonds and shares. The Fund seeks to apply a high risk investment strategy.

Investment Policy:

In normal market conditions, at least 90% of the Fund's exposure is to bonds, shares and alternative investment strategies (which includes real estate, private equity, hedge fund strategies and commodities).

The Fund gains exposure to bonds (or other similar securities) that are investment grade, non-investment grade and unrated issued by the government, government-related entities, supranational entities and companies based in developed markets and emerging markets. The bonds can be denominated either in US dollars (USD) or developed markets currencies hedged into USD. The Fund gains exposure to shares (or securities similar to shares) issued by companies of any size. Exposures are achieved by the Fund through investing directly into markets or by investing in other funds.

The Fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in other eligible funds although this investment will normally be between 50% and 100%; can have exposures to bonds (or other similar securities) of up to 20% of its assets, and shares (or securities similar to shares) up to 100% of its assets.

The Fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in non-investment grade and unrated bonds.

The Fund may invest, in aggregate, up to 45% of its assets in alternative investment strategies. Individually, the Fund's exposure to these strategies shall not exceed 15% to real estate (indirectly), 20% to hedge funds and 10% each to private equity, commodities and absolute return funds.

The Fund's primary currency exposure is to USD.

The Fund may also invest in derivatives. The Fund may use them for hedging, cashflow management and investment purposes.

- ◆ Currency hedging is carried out in respect of the share class. The aim is to protect against exchange rate fluctuations between the

share class currency AUD and the base currency of the Fund USD.

- ◆ Income is distributed.
- ◆ You may sell your investment on most working days.
- ◆ The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by a benchmark.

Intended Retail Investor

The Portfolio may be suitable for investors looking for a diversified investment solution offering exposure to both bonds and equities and seeking for a reasonable level of capital growth while willing to accept a high degree of risk. Investors should have a long term investment horizon and understand the volatility associated with investments in bonds and equities around the world.

An investment in the Fund is only suitable for investors who are capable of evaluating the risks and merits of such an investment, and who have sufficient resources to bear any loss as the Fund is not guaranteed and they may receive back less than the amount invested. The Fund is designed for use as part of a diversified investment portfolio. Prospective investors should consult with their financial advisor before making an investment.

Term:

The Fund does not have a maturity date.

The PRIP Manufacturer cannot terminate the Fund unilaterally. The Board of Directors may furthermore decide to liquidate the Fund in certain circumstances set out in the prospectus and articles of incorporation of the Fund.

What happens if HSBC Investment Funds (Luxembourg) S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the default of HSBC Investment Funds (Luxembourg) S.A.. The Fund's assets are kept safe by the Depositary Bank and are segregated from the assets of other Funds. This means that the holdings of one Fund are kept separate from the holdings of the other Funds and your investment in the Fund cannot be used to pay the liabilities of any other Fund. There is a potential liability risk for the Depositary if the assets of the Fund are lost. The Depositary is liable in case of its negligent or intentional failure to properly fulfil its obligations pursuant to the 2010 Law.

In the event of a bankruptcy or insolvency of the Depositary Bank or other service provider, investors could experience delays (for example, delays in the processing of subscriptions, conversions and redemption of shares) or other disruptions and there may be a risk of default. The Fund is not covered by an investor compensation or guarantee scheme.

What are the costs?

Cost over time
