# Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide income from dividends and long-term capital growth by investing in companies that may benefit over the long term from the transition to a more sustainable global economy (Sustainable Companies), while promoting ESG characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.

# Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. In normal market conditions, the Fund will invest at least 90% of its assets in shares of Sustainable Companies that are based in, or carry out the larger part of their business activities in, any country including both developed markets and emerging markets. Companies and/or issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies, which may change from time to time. The Investment Adviser will construct a concentrated portfolio of Sustainable Companies aiming for dividend income as well as long-term growth. The Fund can invest up to 20% in China A and China B-shares The Fund may invest up to 10% in Real Estate Investment Trusts and may also invest up to 10% in other funds. 




