Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a portfolio of investment grade and non-investment grade bonds and other similar securities issued by issuers that are based in emerging markets anywhere in the world or issued by governments, government-related entities, supranational entities of emerging markets, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.



Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. The Fund will invest at least 80% of its assets in investment grade and non-investment grade bonds and other similar securities issued by companies with consideration of their meeting certain minimum ESG and E, and S, and G scores and lower carbon intensity criteria. Issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to Excluded Activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies. The Fund invests mostly in bonds which are denominated in US dollars and may invest more than 10% and up to 30% in securities issued by a single sovereign issuer with a non-investment grade credit rating and up to 10% in total return swaps. The Fund may invest up to 10% in onshore Chinese bonds, up to 10% in convertible bonds and up to 15% in contingent convertible securities. Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may
 he at risk
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is
 typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality.
 The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their
 bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.




