# Investment objective

The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income by investing in a concentrated portfolio of bonds that support climate-related or environmental projects, as established by HSBC Green Impact Investment Guidelines, while promoting environmental, social and governance (ESG) Characteristics. The Fund qualifies under Article 8 of SFDR.

# Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. The Fund will normally invest at least 80% in investment grade bonds and non-investment grade bonds and other similar securities issued by government-related entities, supranational entities and companies meeting certain green bond principles. The Fund will invest in developed markets and emerging markets. Green Bond Principles, which are proprietary to HSBC, are used to determine the Fund's investible universe. Issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies. The Fund may invest up to 10% in onshore Chinese bonds and the Fund's exposure to non-USD currencies will be limited to 10% of its assets. The Fund may invest up to 10% in non-investment grade bonds or similar securities, up to 10% in contingent convertible securities, up to 10% in asset backed securities and mortgage-backed securities and up to 10% in other funds. # 🚺 Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.






