# Investment objective

The Fund aims to make a positive environmental, social and governance (ESG) effect, by investing in bonds and other similar securities issued by companies/issuers that contribute to United Nations Sustainable Development Goals while also aiming to provide long term capital growth and income. The Fund qualifies under Article 9 of SFDR.



# Investment strategy

The Fund is actively managed. The Fund invests at least 90% of its assets in investment grade and non-investment grade bonds and unrated bonds and other similar securities issued in Contributing Companies/Issuers, that are based in emerging markets. The Fund's investments will be primarily denominated in US Dollar. The Fund will also invest in ESG labelled bonds aligned with the International Capital Market Association principles. The Fund's investment principles together with sustainability analysis and fundamental qualitative company/issuer analysis are used to determine the Fund's investments. Companies and/or issuers considered for inclusion within the Fund's portfolio will be subject to excluded activities in accordance with HSBC Asset Management's Responsible Investment Policies. The Fund may invest up to: 10% in onshore Chinese bonds; 10% in convertible bonds; 15% in contingent convertible securities; 10% in other funds; and can invest in bank deposits and money market instruments. ## Main risks

- The Fund's unit value can go up as well as down, and any capital invested in the Fund may be at risk.
- The Fund invests in bonds whose value generally falls when interest rates rise. This risk is typically greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment and the higher its credit quality. The issuers of certain bonds, could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds and default. Bonds that are in default may become hard to sell or worthless.
- The Fund may invest in Emerging Markets, these markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.




